

Newsom To Issue 10,000 - 20,000 Layoff Notices to SF Workers This Week

City Moves to Implement 37.5 Hour Work Week Proposal



SEIU 1021 has joined the SF Labor Council's Public Employees' Committee (PEC) to fight back Newsom's plans to impose a 37.5 work week. The PEC has offered to discuss alternatives to close the projected \$500 million dollar deficit in the City.

Alternatives must include new revenues, efficiency ideas and across the board cuts - not just cuts to union members.

Getting a pink slip DOES NOT necessarily mean a layoff will happen in May, but it MIGHT. This is the reason we need to fight back.

SEIU is fighting back to get the best possible outcome for everyone. We are using our political power, our legal options, and appealing to the public.

San Francisco union members are our greatest strength and you'll be hearing more about future activities. **WE WILL NEED EVERYONE TO DO THEIR PART!**
