	<p>YES ON PROP. 15</p>	<p>Prop 15: Schools and Communities First Brings \$12 billion to local communities and frontline workers by closing a huge corporate property tax loophole.</p> 
	<p>YES ON PROP. 16</p>	<p>Prop 16: Opportunity for All Prop. 16 will allow the State of California to consider race and gender with the goal of eliminating discrimination in state contracts, hiring and college admissions.</p>
	<p>YES ON PROP. 17</p>	<p>Prop 17: Restore Voting Rights for Parolees This would allow parolees to vote, an important step forward for a disenfranchised group of people, who are overwhelmingly poor and Black or brown.</p>
	<p>YES ON PROP. 18</p>	<p>Prop 18: Expanding Access to Voting for Young People This would allow people who will be 18 at the time of a general election to vote in the preceding primary elections when they are only 17.</p>
	<p>NO ON PROP. 20</p>	<p>Prop. 20: Repealing Criminal Justice Reform Brings back higher prison spending and extreme sentences for minor crimes.</p>
	<p>YES ON PROP. 21</p>	<p>Prop. 21: Rent control Gives back to local communities the power to control rent increases, which was taken away in a corrupt power grab 25 years ago.</p>
	<p>NO ON PROP. 22</p>	<p>Prop. 22: Eliminates Protection for App-Based Workers SEIU members know better than to be fooled by the wealthy corporate sponsors of Prop. 22. Uber, Lyft and Doordash wrote Prop. 22 for one reason only: to boost their profits by denying drivers' fair wages, sick leave, workers' compensation and unemployment.</p> 
	<p>YES ON PROP. 23</p>	<p>Prop 23: Protecting Dialysis Patients Increases protections for kidney patients.</p>
	<p>YES ON PROP. 25</p>	<p>Prop 25: Ending Money Bail The \$2 billion for-profit bail bond industry has poured money into trying to uphold an unfair system that deepens racial and economic inequities and that fails to make our communities safer.</p>
